



PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA MODI'S USA VISIT

3.2. Strategic Discussions on Tariffs, Extradition, Illegal Immigration, and the Russia-Ukraine Conflict

Both leaders recognized that streamlined tariffs would not only boost bilateral trade but also support job creation and economic growth.

Finally, the global impact of the Russia-Ukraine conflict was analyzed, with both sides agreeing on the necessity of a coordinated approach to uphold international stability and safeguard the rules-based order.

4. Bilateral Engagements and High-Level Meetings

4.1. Meeting with Elon Musk – Head of U.S. Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE)

By fostering a closer relationship in defense technologies and strategic systems, this initiative aims to create a robust security architecture capable of addressing both conventional and unconventional threats.

Autonomous Systems Industry Alliance (ASIA)

Under the umbrella of defense industrial cooperation, the newly announced Autonomous Systems Industry Alliance (ASIA) is poised to be a game-changer in the field of modern warfare. This alliance focuses on the development of cutting-edge autonomous systems, with particular emphasis on underwater domain awareness.

ASIA represents a collaborative effort to integrate advanced technologies into defense strategies. The alliance is designed to drive innovation in autonomous systems, ensuring that both nations are equipped with next-generation capabilities to address emerging security challenges. It underscores the strategic priority given to technological superiority in modern defense.

Enhanced Military Collaboration and Joint Exercises

Another significant aspect of the visit was the commitment to elevate military collaboration through enhanced training exercises and joint operations. Initiatives such as an expanded “Tiger Triumph” tri-service exercise are set to improve operational readiness and strategic interoperability between the Indian and U.S. armed forces.

This enhanced military collaboration is not only about conducting exercises but also about building mutual trust and ensuring that both nations are prepared for rapid response in crisis situations. By aligning their operational protocols and sharing intelligence, India and the U.S. aim to create a more cohesive and effective military partnership.

5.3. Economic and Trade Initiatives

“Mission 500” Trade Goal and Bilateral Trade Agreement

The economic agenda of the visit included the ambitious “Mission 500” initiative, which aims to double bilateral trade to \$500 billion by 2030. This bold target is designed to catalyze economic growth and create substantial opportunities for businesses in both countries.

In tandem with this trade goal, discussions were held on negotiating a comprehensive multi-sector Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) by the fall of 2025. The agreement is expected to streamline trade practices, reduce tariff and non-tariff barriers, and ultimately foster a more balanced and prosperous economic relationship between India and the United States.

Greenfield Investments and Market Access Enhancements

In addition to trade reforms, the visit highlighted the importance of attracting greenfield investments. By facilitating investments in high-value sectors, both nations aim to stimulate economic growth and generate employment opportunities.

Efforts to enhance market access for various products and services were also discussed. These measures include lowering tariffs on key sectors and improving the regulatory environment to support increased bilateral commerce. 5.4. Energy Security and Civil Nuclear Cooperation

U.S.-India Energy Security Partnership

Energy security remains a critical component of national stability, and the visit reaffirmed the commitment to strengthen cooperation in the energy sector. The U.S.-India Energy Security Partnership focuses on ensuring reliable, affordable, and sustainable energy supplies through joint initiatives in oil, gas, and liquefied natural gas (LNG).

U.S.-India 123 Civil Nuclear Agreement

INDUS Innovation Bridge and Trusted Supply Chains

In parallel with the TRUST initiative, the INDUS Innovation Bridge is aimed at strengthening industry–academic partnerships and creating trusted supply chains for vital components. Focus areas include semiconductors, critical minerals, advanced materials, and pharmaceuticals.

This initiative is designed to mitigate vulnerabilities in global supply chains by promoting localised production and innovation. It underscores the importance of technological self-reliance and aims to build a more secure and efficient framework for the production and distribution of essential goods.

Strategic Mineral Recovery and Civil Space Cooperation
